Ghar is a home for orphan, abandoned and vulnerable girls, disabled women and the elderly. Located in Pune it is a replica of a home with three generations of residents residing together much alike children, parents and grandparents residing in a home. Most of the 35 girls learn in English medium with high quality education. The girls are all exposed to the opportunities of extracurricular activities such as yoga, sports, vocal and instrumental lessons, art and craftwork. Girls are provided a healthy and nutritious diet as well as chances to celebrate the national holidays with everyone.

HOW WE CONTRIBUTED?

Everyone has a desire to do something for those who are less fortunate. It touched our hearts to spend quality time with the girls to bring a smile on their faces.
